

Spring Game to feature new running backs, receivers, Vic Penn

Most USC students are looking forward to the Carolina Cup and the third round of The Masters this Saturday.

But by the time the sun sets these events will be over and it will be time for the Spring Game.

For those of you that know the Spring Game is the public scrimmage

the football team holds at the end of its 15-session spring practice.

The varsity squad will be divided into two teams with one wearing garnet and the other team wearing white. They will play the game like a regular season game except that there will be no punts or kickoffs.

This year's spring game will answer some questions for the

coaching staff about next year's team.

The biggest loss from the 1996 Carolina football team was senior running back Duce Staley.

When Staley hurt his ankle in the Vanderbilt game last year the fans and the coaches got a glimpse of what the backfield will look like this year.

At running back, the Gamecocks

will start senior Scott Moritz, who scored against Tennessee and was then bit on the buttocks by their mascot Smokey. His competition for the running back spot will be sophomore Boo Williams.

At wide receiver, head coach Brad Scott said he expects redshirt sophomore Kerry Hood to have his break-out year this season.

Scott also hopes the junior Zola Davis will leave the funk that he was in last year when he only caught 16 balls for 306 yards and only one touchdown.

He also is looking for big performances from redshirt freshmen Jermale Kelly and Donovan Norman. Norman will not play in the spring game because he broke his collar

bone in warm-ups last week.

The other new player this spring will be redshirt freshman Vic Penn. Penn will be the favorite to back-up junior Anthony Wright this fall.

The game will start at 7 p.m. and is free to USC students who present a USC ID card at the gate. Regular admission is \$5 for adults and \$10 for families.
