cock National Collegiate Association for Racing."

The constitution contains guidelines for membership in the USC organization. Engineering students interested in becoming a member must submit a resume to the USC racing team. Team members are selected by a two-thirds-majority team vote. Team size will be limited to 25 members.

Eligibility to become a driver is possible after completing 40 hours of team service. According to Byrd, the crew chief, this includes applying classroom knowledge to the race car. Mem-

bers must understand what causes the car to perform best, including balance and weight distributions.

Potential drivers must also have an acceptable driving record registered with the NCAR Commission, no reckless driving or DUI conviction and be of sophomore standing or higher.

"NCAR raises the enthusiasm among engineering students," Cotsford said. "We not only get hands-on experience, but get the opportunity to compete competitively."

Crew members and NCAR Engineering Faculty Advisor Dr. Jeffrey Morehouse expects the team size to grow before the official start of the season in February. Morehouse also expects the number of teams in NCAR to reach about 20.

"What we're aiming for is a racing league," Morehouse said. "We're looking for television coverage. We want Turner, Fox or ESPN to treat this as a regular sport."

The flooding also has caused trouble with the girls' schoolwork. Niemi had a calculus quiz and Desai had a Spanish test Friday morning. The girls were up most of the night dealing with the water and then had to study.

"I know I could have done better on some of the things I had to do," Ahn said.

Ahn also is dissatisfied with how the situation has been handled. She said no one has shown them any sympathy or has seemed to care except Collin Locklair, residence life coordinator of the Horseshoe area.

"It wasn't until our parents started raising hell that anyone started noticing," Ahn said. "Collin has been our only link. He even 'dryvaced' last Sunday."

Luna said the situation would have been handled the same way whether or not the students' parents called.

"What I mind is that the building flooded," Luna said. "It's a brand new building that we've spent money on. It shouldn't be flooding. And it's been the same students every time."

"The students have been quite patient, but we've used up their patience. It needs to be fixed. They should be able to live there without the threat of flooding."

Luna said the insurance of the contractor and subcontractors will pay for the damage to the students' property.

"That will take a while to get the money from the insurance companies," Luna said. "Until then, I've committed Housing funds to help the students."
