Price said the mass media is being responsive to what they believe are the public's desires.

"What is bothersome to me, as a member of the public, is the number of people who will buy the papers and watch the broadcasts," he said. "It doesn't say much about us as a public."

Assistant professor of the College of Journalism and Mass Communications Ernest Wiggins, maintains Clinton's dishonesty is not acceptable.

"Now, I just don't trust him. He has made excellent policy decisions [in the past] and promotes good things when he is surrounded by smart and productive people."

Among other things, the president's psychological condition is being ana-

lyzed. "Charismatic leaders are often the kind of people who have high energy, sexual energy and great opportunity," said Keith Davis, psychology professor. "As far as the president is concerned, this is a combination of opportunity and poor judgement."

Robert Oldendick, associate professor of government and international studies, is concerned with both short-term effects and long-term impact. "Clinton will be a weak president for the remainder of his term if this is resolved. It will impact policy issues as well as disrupting the balance between the three branches."

"The congress is now [the] much stronger [branch of government]."
