South Carolina, Clemson resume rivalry in Death Valley looking to recover from back-to-back defeats

tage in Clemson and a 58-35-4 lead overall in the series, which dates back to 1896.

The Tigers have already accepted a bid to play in the Gator Bowl in Jacksonville and will likely play either Virginia Tech or Notre Dame.


Saturday should be no exception. The Gamecocks and Tigers bring two of the best defenses in the country into Saturday's meeting.
