Athletics department spokesman Kerry Tharp said he doesn't expect Holtz to need back surgery. Holtz underwent back surgery in 1995 when he was head coach at Notre Dame.

The accident kept Holtz from testifying at a U.S. Senate hearing on gambling in college sports. However, it didn't keep him off the golf course. He participated in a Lake City Gamecock Club outing last Friday.

"I can do everything normal," he

told The Greenville News. "It's just that I've got a lot of pain."

Though there aren't any torn ligaments in his right knee, Tharp said that it was "puffy."

"[Holtz] is limping a little, but he's swinging away," Tharp added.

The Gamecocks' coach will continue his spring schedule of speaking engagements and will head to the Middle East on May 12 to talk with U.S. troops in Saudi Arabia and Kuwait. Holtz also will speak to troops on an aircraft carrier.
