Referendum would let officials gamble

COLUMBIA- A joint resolution that would let people vote on whether any elected officials could play the South Carolina Education Lottery was introduced Tuesday by Rep. John Scott, D-Columbia. The state's Constitution says it's illegal for anyone

holding "an office of honor, trust or profit," to gamble. As the law stands, it's not clear whether officials such as city councilmen, notaries public or even school board members can play the lottery, Scott said.

NATION

American Taliban officially charged

WASHINGTON-John Walker Lindh, the 20-yearold Californian who fought with the Taliban in Afghanistan, was charged Tuesday with conspiracy to kill U.S. citizens. He will be tried in a civilian court and could face life in prison.

After weeks of deliberation, The Bush administration opted against a military trial or charges that would carry the death penalty.

Lindh, who converted to Islam at 16 and is alleged to have trained at an al-Qaida camp in Afghanistan, was charged in a criminal complaint filed in U.S. District Court in Alexandria, Va. He will be transferred

from a U.S. military ship for trial in the United States. Attorney General John Ashcroft said Lindh admitted that he met Osama bin Laden and knew bin Laden had ordered the Sept. 11 attacks on the United States.

WORLD

West Bank violence leaves two dead

TULKAREM, WEST BANK-Two Israelis were killed in

gun attacks in the West Bank on Tuesday, including one with American citizenship, even as the two largest Palestinian factions, Fatah and Hamas, said they would stick by a truce despite the death of a militia leader.

The body of a 72-year old Israeli-American man was found in a bullet-riddled car in the Palestinian town of Beit Sahour, Palestinian security officials said.

Israeli officials identified the man as engineer Avi Boaz, an Israeli who also holds American citizenship.


