### Three students get academic awards

Three USC students have been granted prestigious awards for their academic achievement in college.

Fourth-year political science student Kristina L. Cooper has been named one of the 40 Jack Kent Cooke Undergraduate Scholars during the program's

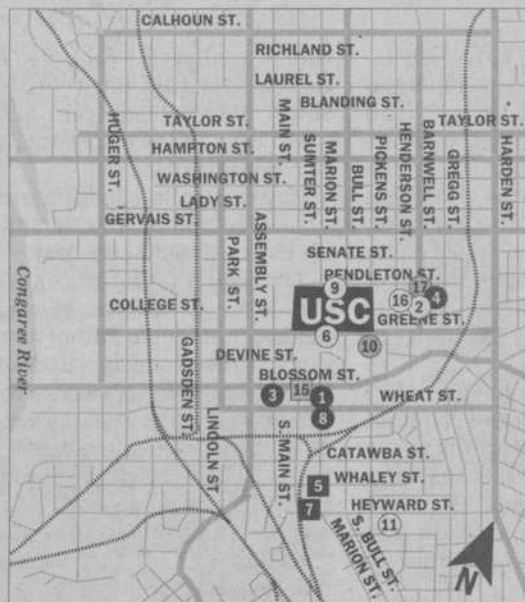
first year. The \$30,000 scholarship will allow her to compete in an independent study program this fall at the Ailey School at the Alvin Ailey American Dance Center.

Third-year International Studies and Spanish student Ann Hardman has been selected as a 2002 United States Department of State Thomas R. Pickering Foreign Affairs Fellow, and is the

first USC student to earn this distinction, as well as the only student from South Carolina to win.

Robin W. Poston, a May 2001 corporate finance graduate, has been named a Golden Key Scholar, a prestigious international honor awarded by Golden Key International Honour society. Poston was one of 12 Golden Key members to win a \$10,000 scholarship.

Floor Plan

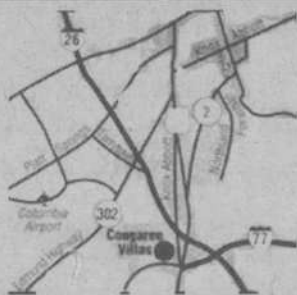
