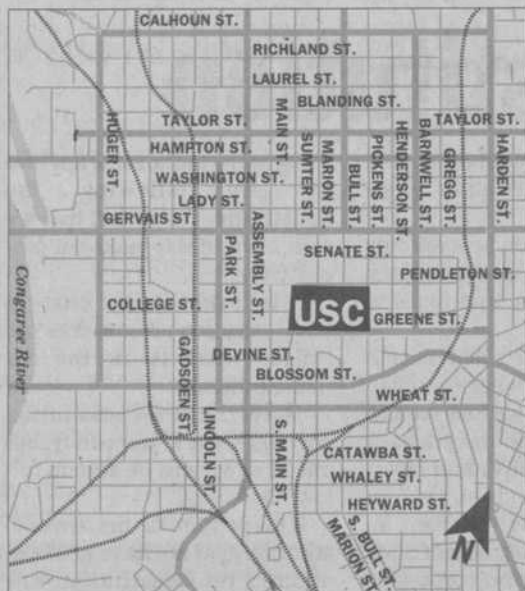


## POLICE REPORT

② **VANDALISM, SUMWALT COLLEGE, 1212 GREENE ST.**
