pleaded guilty to one count of statutory rape, and had prepared a plea bargain. But in 1978, Polanski fled the United States. He has since been living in France and has never returned. Many think Polanski would win the Oscar if it weren't for his legal problems.

The best-supporting-actor category, refreshingly felon-free, shapes up like this: Ed Harris received a nomination for "The Hours." Christopher Walken from "Catch Me if You Can" and Chris Cooper from "Adaptation" also got nods. John C. Reilly, who also appears in the nominated "Gangs of New York" and "The Hours," earned a nod for his "Chicago" performance. But expect the winner to be Paul Newman, who was nominated for his superb work in "The Road to Perdition." Combining Hollywood glam-

our with red-carpet gossip, the Academy Awards program airs March 23 on ABC. Prepare a bag of movie-theater-butter-flavored popcorn and cheer on your favorite nominees.
