Hot bats from the LSU game carried over in the elimination game against Miami as the Gamecocks lived to see another day with a 15-11 victory over the Hurricanes. Winn tied a CWS record by scoring four runs on the day and added a threerun home run. Tolleson and Steve Pearce also blasted home runs for the Gamecocks' first homers at Rosenblatt Stadium.

Billy Buckner (7-2) got the win

for Carolina in his first start in two weeks, striking out 10 Hurricane batters while giving up four runs on five hits.

The Gamecocks scored four runs in the first two innings and led by as much as 12-0. Miami rallied in the top of the ninth to put a scare in the Gamecocks, but the Hurricanes fell just short of a comeback.

USC's road gets even harder as the Gamecocks must beat Cal State Fullerton tomorrow at 7 p.m. and Thursday to advance to the championship series.
