Students should never give out any of their personal information using e-mails, a medium easily harnessed by identity thieves. Personal information includes account names and passwords to shopping Web sites, credit card information and Social Security numbers.

Colin Crawford, a third-year statistics student and two-year eBay veteran, said he might have fallen victim to a scam e-mail if he had been in a hurry when he received it.

"I do more selling than buying," he said. "I would feel uncomfortable about answering it after doing so much business with eBay, but I wouldn't think about it if I were busy trying to get something through. I like eBay a

Sasha Noorani, a first-year business and psychology student, said she'd received e-mail from spammers pretending to represent the legitimate Web site Half.com.

"There were misspelled words. That was a big clue that it wasn't official," she said. "I would never give my username or password in an e-mail. I'd go to the Web site."

Web sites are much more trustworthy than e-mail.

"Never reply to e-mails that ask for personal information," eBay advises its store," she said.

users. "E-mail is a risky way to send your personal information - especially financial or other sensitive information. You can help protect your identity by refusing to give personal information (such as Social Security Numbers and account passwords) via e-mail and by never downloading e-mail attachments that are sent from someone you do not know."

Spoof e-mail may include a forged e-mail address in the "From" line. Some might actually be real e-mail addresses that have been forged. (From: billing@ebay.com; From: eBayAcctMaintenance@eBay.com; support@ebay.com)

B. E-mail greeting

Many spoof e-mails will begin with a general greeting such as "Welcome eBay C. Urgency
