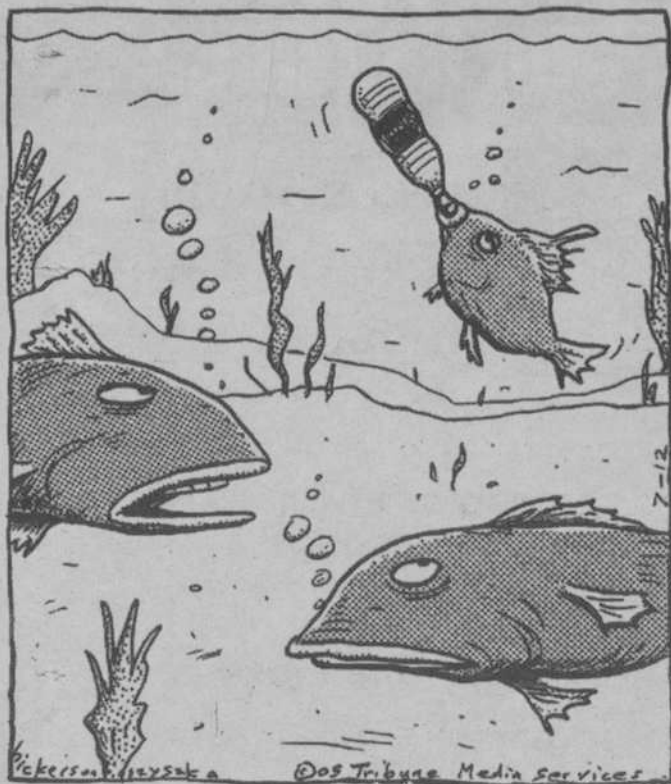

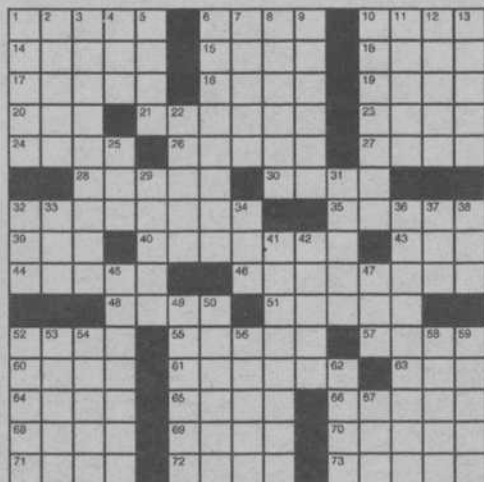

olds, is different from other boutiques and stores because it is "a little trendier than most other places," Powers said.
