Men's tennis give strong showing at SEC Indoor Championships


The USC men's tennis squad sent one player to the main draw and another through the consolation bracket to finish the SEC Indoor Championships in Lexington, KY.


Yevengy Supeko fell to Eric Claesson of Ole Miss 6-2, 6-1 in the main draw.


