


# SEVENTY-FIVE "Old Timers" HONORED WITH AWARDS AT BANQUET

Beginning with the first payday in 1957, your share of the cost of the Government Social Security Program is increased from 2% to 21/1% of your earnings so covered. This money is turned over by your company to the United States Government. The increased deduction is made necessary by law to meet the ever increasing cost and ex-

Under The Law, we are tension of Social Security benefits.

Your Company's Share of the cost of Social Security is also adjusted upward. From 1957 on, the company pays a tax equal to  $2\frac{1}{4}e$  of the pay of each covered employee. Combined employer - emplovee contributions toward Social Security now equal 412'; of such payroll. If you have any questions about this change, please don't hesitate to talk to your supervisor.
