Coldest April in Many Years.

Washington.—According to the weather bureau records, the month just closed was the coldest April in the last 26 years, and within a degree of the coldest April ever experienced. The month was characterized by a succession of cold spells which swept southeastward over the northeast Rocky Mountain slope and gradually spread southward and eastward over the entire country east of the Rocky Mountains. The cold was almost continuous except for brief intervals of a day or so of warmer weather.
