Denver, Colorado, had a "cleaning up" week not long proclamation on the subject, in the course of which he said :

"A city free from dirt, in perfect health and made attractive in all its details will advertise itself and draw within its boundaries the best of people." A circular giving rules which the city cleaners should follow gives such a grand time in Lancaster, among others these:

"Rake on a pile, the tin cans, bottles, etc., on the vacant lots near you, the day before your clean-up day, and they will be pressed a desire of paying you bauled away by city teams.

"Plant trees and sow grassdo not live without a lawn.

"Repair your fences, gates and sheds-paint or whitewash

"Burn all your rubbish possi ble. Do not throw it in the street, alley or vacant fots.

"Repair your sidewalks. "Take all dandeliens out of The Lady your lawn-they spoil its beauty and in time will destroy it.

"If your residence, store front. wagons, signs or automobiles look old or faded, have them repainted.

"Keep down the weeds on your property, and while they are young have them destroyed on the vacant lots near you.

"If your awnings are old, torn or faded, get new ones.

"Do not spit on the sidewalks. The city is trying to keep those in the business district especially clean by washing them several times each week.

"Wherever you find anything remedy, telephone the health department at city hall.

"Sewer connections, garbage caus and ash pits are necessities that they are provided-kept clean and in good condition."
