Tax Notice.

The tax books will be open at the The tax books will be open at the Treasurer's office for the collection of taxes from October 15th, 1908, until March 15th, 1909. Taxes can be paid without penalty from October 15th, to December 31st, 1908, and during the month of January, 1909, a penalty of 1 per cent will be charged on all unpaid taxes, during February an additional 1 per cent will be charged on all unpaid taxes, and from March 1st to 15th, an additional 5 per cent will be charged on all unpaid taxes.

The tax levy for State purposes is 5 1-2

The tax levy for State purposes is 5 1-2 mills, for ordinary county purposes 3½ mills, for special county purposes 1½ mills, for road and bridge purposes 4 mills, and school purposes 3 mills, making a total levy of 17½ mills on all taxable property of the county. There is a special levy of 2½ mills for Railroad Bond purposes, in Cane Creek. road Bond purposes, in Cane Creek, Gills Creek and Pleasant Hill Townships. In School District No. 4, or (L. G. S.) there is a special levy of 5½ mills for School and School Bond purposes, in School District No. 40 (K. G. S.) there is a levy of 7 mills for School and School Bond purposes, in School District No. 38 there is a special levy of 5 mills for School purposes, in School Districts Nos. 2 and 24 a special levy of 3 mills for School purposes, in School Districts Nos. 5, 30, 32, and 46, a special levy of 2 mills for School purposes, and in School Districts Nos. 12, 17, 23, 27, 39 and 49 a special levy of 4 mills for School purposes.

There is also a tax of \$1.00, for School purposes, on each male citizen between the age of 21, and 60. years old, except those who are disabled or other-wise exempted by law, and a tax of \$3.00, on every male citizen between the ages of 21, and 55, years, for Road and Bridge
