Series of Sermons on Paul and His Writings.

Dr. Boldridge began last Sunday evening a series of sermons on Paul and his writings. The first sermon was on the birth, place, parentage, early surrounding, and education of the apostle to the Gentiles. The theme for next Sunday evening will be the "Conversion of Saul of Tarsus." The passages of scripture which bear on it and which may well be read by those who really want to make a thorough study of the life of this great preacher to the Gentiles are as follows: For his conversion see:

1. Acts, 9:1-31. This was written for general readers in the regular course of apostolic history.
2. Acts, chapter 22. This was for Jews. Better read Acts 21:35 to 22:1-30. This was a vindication of himself before the hostile Jews at Jerusalem.
3. Acts, chapter 26. For Romans, it was spoken before Agrippa. The material is essentially the same in each case, but is used on each occasion so as to be adapted to the hearers. Difference of occasion gave a slight difference of setting. A study of these passages will prepare one for the next Sunday evening service at the Baptist church. All are invited to attend these sermons with the hope that much good may be done by them.

NEW EXHIBITS AT THE STATE FAIR

October 26 to 30--Prizes for Successful Farmers.

One of the best attractions at the State Fair this year, which will be held in Columbia beginning Monday, October 21st and closing Friday, October 30th, will be the Field Crop Department. This new feature will prove of interest to every farmer in the State. It will be under the management of Prof. J. N. Harper, Director of the Clemson Experimental Station, who is one of the best agricultural experts in the South. Professor Harper has personally selected the exhibits for this department, and will arrange everything to advantage. He will be assisted by his whole corps of expert assistants, and it will be worth the trip to the fair just to talk to these experts and get their ideas on practical farming.

Clemson College will have a big exhibit in this department, but will not be allowed to compete with the individual exhibits. Some fine prizes will be awarded the farmers. For instance, \$25 will be given for the largest yield of corn to the acre, \$25 for the second best, and cotton will have the same amount awarded for the best yield per acre. Dozens of other interesting contests have been provided.

President Mobley, being a practical stockman himself, is giving much attention to this part of the fair. There will be more thoroughness shown than ever before. The stalls have all been renovated and the pure water from the city has been connected, so that the cattle and stock will be well taken care of. This will be good news to hundreds of breeders who might otherwise have hesitated to send their stock to the fair. The poultry show bids fair to be a grand success this year. There seems to be more interest in every department. The management believes this will be the largest and best fair ever held here. Tax Notice.

The tax books will be open at the Treasurer's office for the collection of taxes from October 15th, 1908, until March 15th, 1909. Taxes can be paid without penalty from October 15th, to December 31st, 1908, and during the month of January, 1909, a penalty of 1 per cent will be charged on all unpaid taxes, during February an additional 1 per cent will be charged on all unpaid taxes, and from March 1st to 15th, an additional 5 per cent will be charged on all unpaid taxes.

The tax levy for State purposes is 5 1/2 mills, for ordinary county purposes 3 1/2 mills, for special county purposes 1 1/2 mills, for road and bridge purposes 4 mills, and school purposes 3 mills, making a total levy of 17 1/2 mills on all taxable property of the county. There is a special levy of 2 1/2 mills for Railroad Bond purposes, in Cane Creek, Gills Creek and Pleasant Hill Townships. In School District No. 4, or (L. G. S.) there is a special levy of 5 1/2 mills for School and School Bond purposes, in School District No. 40 (K. G. S.) there is a levy of 7 mills for School and School Bond purposes, in School District No. 38 there is a special levy of 5 mills for School purposes, in School Districts Nos. 2 and 24 a special levy of 3 mills for School purposes, in School Districts Nos. 5, 30, 32, and 46, a special levy of 2 mills for School purposes, and in School Districts Nos. 12, 17, 23, 27, 39 and 49 a special levy of 4 mills for School purposes.

There is also a tax of \$1.09, for School purposes, on each male citizen between the age of 21, and 60, years old, except those who are disabled or otherwise exempted by law, and a tax of \$3.00, on every male citizen between the ages of 21, and 55, years, for Road and Bridge purposes.

All information as to taxes will be promptly given upon application.

In sending for a statement of taxes, state with whom tax payer lived in January last, and if known by two names, give both, and be sure to give township and No. of School Dist., in which the taxpayer lived when return was made.
