American Textile Manufacturer

Tuscaloosa, Ala.—There is a rumor afloat that Tuscaloosa stands a good chance to secure a large cotton mill which will cost about \$300,000.

Calhoun, N. C.—C. E. Wilson and John Cox are understood to be completing arrangements for the erection of a knitting mill at Calhoun, about 10 miles from Hendersonville, N. C.

Welford, S. C.—Jordan Manufacturing Company will soon install new spinning machines in their mill, making their own yarns. This will add materially to the business of the company.

High Point, N. C.—The High Point Hosiery Mills Co. will add to its dyeing facilities and has received plans and specifications for the erection of a 50x100 foot one-story brick addition, upon which work has begun. This company is operating 300 knitting machines, etc., on the production of ribbed hosiery, which it dyes and finishes ready for the market.

Williamston, S. C.—Capt. Sullivan has received a letter from a very prominent gentleman of Greenville in which he offers to build a \$200,000 cotton mill here if the town will raise as much as \$75,000. No definite steps have been taken in regard to the matter, but very likely Capt. Sullivan will call a meeting of the board of trade to consider the matter at an early date.

Laurens, S. C.—The board of directors of the Watts Cotton Mills located here, have issued a call for a meeting of the stockholders to be held at the offices of the company on April 6 for the purpose of determining whether or not the company shall issue preferred stock in the amount of \$200,000.

Chapel Hill, N. C.—W. A. Ellington, of Chapel Hill, N. C., has organized the Lois Hosiery Mills for the purpose of establishing a plant. He has secured a suitable building and contracted for an equipment of machinery, including 25 knitters and a 10 horse-power gasoline engine. The mill will have a capacity of 100 dozen pairs of hose and will employ 20 operatives. It is planned to enlarge the mill later in the year.

Albany, Ga.—The Albany Cotton Mills Company was organized with a paid-up capital stock of \$250,000 at a meeting held in the office of the Albany Business League yesterday afternoon. Four fifths of the stockholders are Albany people.

The enterprise launched a year and a half ago and held up by the hard times, was taken up again several weeks ago and rapidly pushed through. Eastern mill architects were telegraphed to hurry plans already tentatively agreed upon, and the mill will be built with the minimum of delay. W. W. Page, one of the most prominent business men of Albany, was elected president of the company.
