**GOVERNMENT WANTS
SEVERAL GOOD CLERKS**

Those Qualified in Statistics, Accounting and Business Administration.

The United States Civil Service Commission announces open competitive examinations for the positions listed above, for both men and women. Vacancies in the office of the chief of ordnance, war department, Washington, D. C., and in the ordnance department at large throughout the United States, at salaries ranging from \$1,400 a year for Grade 1, and from \$1,400 to \$1,800 a year for Grade 2, will be filled from these examinations, unless it is found in the interest of the service to fill any vacancy by reinstatement, transfer, or promotion.

The salary in either grade, within the range stated, will depend upon the qualifications of the appointee.

This announcement cancels announcement No. 2030 of the examination for clerk qualified in statistics or accounting.

Competitors will not be required to report for examination at any place, but will be rated on the following subjects, which will have the relative weights indicated:

Subjects and Weights.

Physical ability	10
Educational, training and experience	90
Total	100

Under the second subject competitors will be rated upon the sworn statements in their applications and upon corroborative evidence adduced by the commission.

tabulation of facts and data concerning statistics and the preparation of charts and graphics for manufacturing purposes.

For Grade 1 applicants must have had the education and experience specified in one of the following groups; and must have received for the six months prior to filing the application a salary at the rate of at least \$800 a year:

(a) Graduation from a college or university of recognized standing and at least one year's experience in duties of the kind required in this position.

(b) Graduation from a standard high school or education equivalent to that required for such graduation, one year of a course in business administration in a college or university of recognized standing, and at least one year's experience in duties of the kind required in this position.

(c) The completion of a common school education or its equivalent and three years' experience in duties of the kind required in this position, one year of a standard high school course being accepted in lieu of six months of such experience.

For Grade 2 applicants must have had the education and one additional year of the experience specified in one of the above groups and must have received for the six months prior to filing the application a salary at the rate of at least \$1,200 a year.

Clerk Qualified in Accounting.
The duties of this position involve the keeping of accounts relative to the operations of purchase and production of government materials.

For Grade 1 applicants must have had the education and experience specified in one of the following groups and must have received for the six months prior to filing the application a salary at the rate of at least \$800 a year:

(a) Graduation from a college or university of recognized standing and at least one year's experience in duties of the kind required in this position.

(b) Graduation from a standard high school or education equivalent to that required for such graduation, one year of a course in business administration in a college or university of recognized standing, and

at least one year's experience in duties of the kind required in this position.

(c) The completion of a common school education or its equivalent and three years' experience in duties of the kind required in this position, one year of a standard high school course being accepted in lieu of six months of such experience.

For Grade 2 applicants must have had the education and one additional year of the experience specified in one of the above groups and must have received for six months prior to filing the application a salary at the rate of at least \$1,200 a year.

Clerks Qualified in Business Administration.

The duties of this position involve work on the organization of a system of scientific production, control and distribution of stores and supplies.

For Grade 1 applicants must have had the education and experience specified in one of the following groups and must have received for the six months prior to filing the application a salary at the rate of at least \$800 a year:

(a) Graduation from a college or university of recognized standing and at least one year's experience in duties of the kind required in this position.

(b) Graduation from a standard high school or education equivalent to that required for such graduation, one year of a course in business administration in a college or university of recognized standing, and at least one year's experience in duties of the kind required in this position.

(c) The completion of a common school education or its equivalent and three years' experience in duties of the kind required in this position, one year of a standard high school course being accepted in lieu of six months of such experience.

For Grade 2 applicants must have had the education and one additional year of the experience specified in one of the above groups and must have received for the six months prior to filing the application a salary at the rate of at least \$1,200 a year.

Applicants must have reached their twentieth birthday on the date

of making oath to the application. Persons of military age accepting appointments will not thereby avoid the obligations of the selective service law.

Applicants must submit with their applications their photographs, taken within two years, with their names written thereon. Tintypes or proofs will not be accepted.

Applicants will be admitted to these examinations regardless of their residence and domicile; but only those who have been actually domiciled in the State or Territory in which they reside for at least one year previous to the date of making oath to the application, and who have the county officer's certificate in the application form executed, may become eligible for permanent appointment to the apportioned service in Washington, D. C.

On account of the urgent needs of the service, applications for these examinations will be received until further notice. Papers will be rated promptly and certification made as the needs of the service require.

These examinations are open to all citizens of the United States who meet the requirements.

Applicants should at once apply for Form 1312, stating the title of the examination desired, to the Civil Service Commission, Washington, D. C.; the Secretary of the United States Civil Service Board, Customhouse, Boston, Mass., New York, N. Y., New Orleans, La., Honolulu, Hawaii; Postoffice, Philadelphia, Pa.; Atlanta, Ga., Cincinnati, Chicago, Ill., St. Paul, Minn., Seattle, Wash., San Francisco, Cal.; Old Customhouse, St. Louis, Mo.; Administration Building, Balboa Heights, Canal Zone, or to the Chairman of the Porto Rican Civil Service Commission, San Juan, P. R.

Applications should be properly executed, excluding the medical certificate, and filed with the Civil Service Commission, Washington, D. C., without delay.

The exact title of the examination desired, as given at the head of this announcement, should be stated in answer to Question 1 of the application form.
