WE ARE NOT AFRAID OF TESTS.

Those people who imagine that the advocates of negro suffrage are working to corrupt the ourity of the ballot box, by bestowing the elecive franchise upon ignorant, illiterate persons, are grossly mistaken. We are told by the opponents of this measure that the mass of the negroes in Tennessee and other States are not intelligent enough to be intrusted with the ballot. Grant that very many of them are. Is there not a very large portion of the white population of this State who are still more ignorant, yet who are permitted to exercise that invaluable right? Now what we ask, and what we shall never cease to ask as long as it is denied us, is the abolition of all absurd distinctions on account of color. If intelligence is to be the test of qualifications as an elector, then let that be the test. We are ready for the examination. Surely, if the white inhabitants of Tennessee are very intelligent, and all the colored inhabitants are very ignorant, they need not fear that any of us will stand the test. They certainly are not afraid that a race that has been kept in bondage and darkness hundreds of years, will be able to show to the judges of the election, that they know anything that would entitle them to a vote. So where is the danger. The white race, that has had all the advantages of makes a people intelligent and enlighted, cerit not be more honorable for the people of Tennessee to say that every citizen of this State shall vote who possesses so much intelligence, no matter what his race or complexion? If you have a mind to make the standard very high, then do so; but give every man an equal chance. We desire to say just this, if ignorant white men have a right to vote, ignorant black men should have the right to vote also. If intelligent white men have the right to vote, intelligent colored men Lave the right also. If any distinction at all is made between voters, it should be made on'the ground of intelligence, and not upon so absurd, foolish a pretext as color. If you choose to require that every voter in Tennessee shall be a graduate of Yale College, we say all right, provided you make the law applicable to white and black men alike. Now we believe that the mass of colored men

in the State would exercise the right of suffrage in an intelligent manner, and that their own interests and the interests of the State would be furthered thereby. But we say to the Legislature, which is soon to meet in our city, if you are afraid that ignorace of the laws and genuis of our institutions, would work injury to our great commonwealth, then establish any rule you in your judgment may deem best, to the end that intelligence may be the criterion by which judges of elections shall be governed, sud that an unreasonable, unjust prejudice on account of color, shall in no wise work injury to a whois race. Wipe out the word " white" from our State Constitution, and, as President Johnson has well said, give every man an equal chance in the race of life, 16 tho meta-keeps ahead, they will have more good their industry, energy and perseverance should outdistance them in the race, we hope they will have manlines enough to acknowledge it.

Now, we feel that our demands are reasonable and just, and we cannot well see how the next legislature can consistently refuse to respond to them. Give us equality before the law of the land, and then "let us severally alone," to sink or swim. We have no desire to be made the "peculiar people" of this country, nor have we any wish to be esteemed more highly than other men. But it is absolutely essential to our happiness, that we have at least a "small voice" in saying who shall and who shall not make the edy to use. "Though not myself a Christian, in marshaling arguments against the institution of castes. I cannot well overlook the beautiful doctrineof the revelation which makes no distinction but between the virtuous and the vicious, recognizes no uncleanness but that of the heart, and invites the poorest and the proudest to one common heaven. The heaven of the Hindoos, like their earth, is made for Brahmins alone; and before the soul can wing its flight thither, it must as a general rule, have passed its Brahminical birth. But the religion of the Gospel inculentes doctrines of a different character .-Is thy soul athirst for God? Dost thou pant after him as the hart panteth after the water brooks? Have the words of the law been a bimp unto thy feet, and a light unto thy path? If so, be of good cheer, whoever thou art-it natters not if thou art Jew or Gentile-the gates of heaven shall be opened to let thee in. Christianity everywhere recognizes the equality of mankind. The rich and the poor meet together, it says, for the Lord is the maker of them all ; and tells us to be as brothers to each other, to love our neighors as we love ourselves, and to do to others as we would be done by. How does all this contrast with the injunctions of caste, which declare to the Brahmin that he is God's vicegerent upon earth, and that he must not pollute himself by coming into too close gontact with his neighbors? and to the Sudra that servitude is his portion through life, and that he must invariably look up to the higher classes with reverence and fear."
