RESULT OF THE STATE ELECTIONS—OFFICIAL COUNT.

We learn from the Columbia correspondent of the Charleston News...

For Governor: Scott, Radical, 84,775; Carpenter, Reform, 50,104.

For Lieutenant-Governor: Ransier, Radical, 83,998; Butler, Reform, 50,441.

Ransier's majority, 33,557. This majority, in the case of both Scott and Ransier, will be reduced about 400 by the action of the board in the case of Chesterfield and Spartanburg...

First District: Dudley, Reform, 11,430; Rainey, Radical, 20,200.

Second District: DeLarge, colored, Republican, 16,686; Bowen, white, Republican, 16,042.

Third District: Elliott, colored, Republican, 20,564; Bacon, Reform, 13,997.

Fourth District: Wallace, Republican, 16,184; McKisick, Reform, 12,206.
