WHAT THE TRIBUNE SAYS.

In State bonds there has been a pretty fair trade. The chief activity, however, was in South Carolina, new January and July bonds, which declined from 37 yesterday to 32 to-day; though later reaching in the street to 35 1/2. The depression in these bonds is due partially to the large sales of bonds' hypothecated on loan, and which the borrower was unable to lift.
