An Act to establish Greenwood County.

Whereas, under the Constitution of the State of South Carolina, Article VII, and an Act of the General Assembly carrying into effect the provisions of the said Article of the Constitution, one-third of the qualified elections residing in those sections of Abbeville and Edge-field Counties which it is proposed to cut off to form the new County of Greenwood, did file their petition with the Governor to comply with the said Article of the Constitution and the Act of the General Assembly aforesaid, and whereas, the Governor did order an election to be held in the said section. Abbeville and Edge-field Counties which election was duly held on the 15th day of becember, A. D., 1896, and more than two-thirds majority off the votes cast in cach section having been in favor of cutting of the section having been and Edge-field Counties to form the new County of Greenwood, and more than two-thirds majority off the votes cast at said election having been cast in favor of "Greenwood" as the name of the said new County and more than two-thirds majority Oil! They shall be closed thirty days before the election in 1896.
