City Registration

BOOKS OF REGISTRATION OF the voters in the City of Abbeville will be open in the office of the Clerk of the City Council from January 13th, 1904, until April 5th, 1904, inclusive. To entitle one to register the following is requisite:

1. The production of a certificate of registration from the Board or Supervisor of Registration of the County.
2. Residence in the city of four months.
3. Payment of all taxes assessed against applicant for fiscal year of 1903.

NOTICE OF REGISTRATION

The books for the registration of all legally qualified voters, and for the issuing of transfers, etc., will be open at the office of Supervisors of Registration in the Court House, between the hour 9 o'clock a. m., and 3 o'clock p. m., on the first Monday of each month, and kept open for three successive days in each month until thirty days before the next general election.

Any person whose qualifications as an elector will be completed after the closing of the Registration Books but before the next election shall have the right to apply for and secure a registration certificate at any time within sixty days immediately preceding the closing of the Registration Books, upon an application under oath to the facts entitling him to such registration.

The registration of voters must be by polling precincts. There must be a Book of Registration for each polling precinct, that is for each township, or parish, or city, or town of less than five thousand inhabitants, or ward of cities of more than five thousand inhabitants. Each elector must vote in the polling precinct in which he resides. If there is more than one voting place in the polling precinct, the elector may vote at any voting place designated on the registration certificate. The Boards must designate in the registration certificate at which the elector is to vote. If there is more than one voting place in the polling precincts, the Boards shall designate on the certificate the voting place selected by the elector. G. H. MOORE, R. O. MCADAMS, W. M. C.
