Pockets Picked.

It is said that several of our men paid the penalty for not taking proper care of their money last Saturday. The heaviest loser whose name we have was that of Mr. John R. Lomax. It was reported that the light-colored artist had relieved him of \$85, which he had in his pocket. Another white man, whose name we have forgotten, lost \$15, and a negro lost \$10. The light-fingered artist, meant no particular harm to anybody. They only wished to teach their victims the propriety of putting their ready money in the great steel vault of one of the banks as a safer and better place of deposit than in their own jeans pockets. The editor of the Press and Banner has no fears of robbers. When he gets a few dollars he immediately wastes it paying debts, or puts it on deposit in one of the banks. A pick pocket artist would not make over \$2 a month robbing our pockets, and if he undertook to rob our iron safe he would find it unlocked and empty of money. We know if an expert should want anything in that safe that he could open it about as easy and about as good as one of the boys about town could open a box of cigars. We don't keep money in our safe, and we don't want any burglar to blow it to pieces, so we just leave it unlocked. We would sooner give him all it contained any night than to have it broken to pieces. Robbers would find us unprofitable subjects upon whom to practice of their profession. We have no money in our pockets, and we leave our empty safe unlocked. Unless they have special spite at us they will not use dynamite on our safe.

Capt. Lyon's Warehouse.

Work on Capt. Lyon's cotton warehouse progresses. The walls are about ready to receive the joists over the basement room. Above the basement will be two stories--making a three story building. The floor of the middle story will be on a level with the floor of the depot and cur. The house is 40 feet high and it is estimated that about one thousand bales can be stored in it. There never was more demand for warehouse room than at present. If Capt. Lyon had his house finished the overflow from the Abbeville warehouse would soon fill it. And the present high price of cotton proves the wisdom of the farmers in building warehouses in which to store their cotton. For several years Capt. Lyon has desired to have a warehouse of his own, which would be conducted according to his own business methods, and his wishes will be gratified as soon as his new warehouse is finished.

An Ordinance

To Raise Supplies for the City of Abbeville, S. C., for the Fiscal Year 1906.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND Aldermen of the City of Abbeville, S. C., in Council assembled and by authority of the same, That a tax for the sums and in a manner hereinafter named shall be raised and paid into the treasury of the City Council for the use and purposes thereof for the fiscal year 1906.

Notice is hereby given that the office of City Treasurer of Abbeville, S. C., will be open for the collection of taxes for said fiscal year 1906, from Wednesday, Nov. 1, 1905, until Monday, January 1, 1906, without penalty.

Rate per centum of taxation are as follows:

City Tax.....3 mills.
Water Works Tax (interest on bonds and Sinking Fund).....3 1/2 mills.
Sewerage.....3 1/2 mills.

That when the taxes and assessment for any portion thereof charged against the property or party on the tax books of the City for the fiscal year 1906, shall not be paid on or before the 1st day of January, 1906, the City Treasurer shall proceed to add a penalty of one per cent, on the tax book, and the City Treasurer shall collect the same; and if the said assessments and penalties are not paid on or before the first day of February next thereafter, an additional penalty of one per centum thereon shall be added by the City Treasurer; and if said taxes, assessments and penalties are not paid on or before the first day of March next thereafter, an additional penalty of five per centum thereon shall be added by the City Treasurer and be collected by him; and if the said taxes, assessments and penalties are not paid on or before the 15th day of March next thereafter, the said City Treasurer shall issue his tax execution for the said taxes, assessments and penalties against the property of the defaulting tax-payers according to law.

A commutation road tax will be collected the same time as other taxes of Two Dollars from all male citizens between the ages of eighteen and fifty-five years, except those exempted by law. Unless said tax is paid on or before the 1st day of January, 1906, six days work upon the public highways and streets of the City will be required under the Street Overseer.

All persons failing or refusing to pay the commutation tax or to work six full days, shall, upon conviction, be fined not more than Thirty Dollars or be imprisoned not longer than thirty days.

Done and ratified in City Council this 10th day of October, 1905.
