

IN MEMORIAM.

Remarks at the Funeral of Mrs. J. T. Bradley.

The funeral service was opened by singing the 8th Psalm, and after reading the 90th Psalm, and prayer, the 103rd Psalm was sung. Then followed remarks by Rev. R. F. Bradley as follows:

Let us not limit our view to the grave, nor think of our loved one as dead, but living in that Paradise where the spirits of just men are made perfect and God himself tells us to comfort ourselves with the certainty that we may meet her again. For we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so they also which sleep in Jesus will be brought with him. Wherefore comfort one another with these words.

We are strangers and pilgrims here as all our fathers were before us, and we have but a short, and it remaineth that they that have wives be as though they had none, and they that weep as though they wept not, and they that buy as though they possessed not, and they that rejoice as though they rejoiced not, and they that use the world as not using it, for the fashion of this world passeth away. And yet, what possibilities are before us! Yes, what certainties! Things which hath not seen, nor ear heard, neither have entered into the heart of man to conceive, if we are only faithful in using the grace which God has given us for salvation. Let us not sleep then, as do others, but let us watch, and work, and pray, and let us be sure that we are made sure and an entrance is ministered to us abundantly into the everlasting Kingdom of God. Be thou faithful unto death, and I will give thee a crown of life. To him that overcometh will I grant to sit with me on my throne, and he also shall overcome and sit down with my father on his throne.

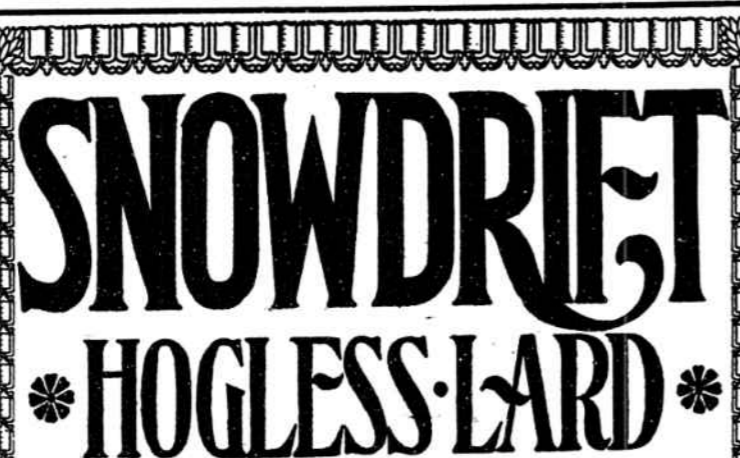

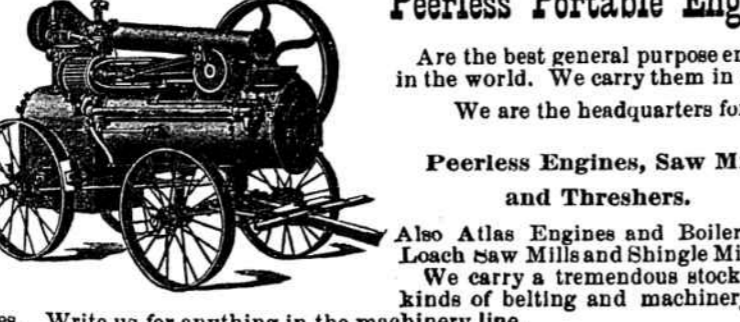
