### NEW CHURCH BUILDING

WILL BE BUILT BY ASSOCIATE REFORMED PRESBYTERIANS.

Contract Has Been Awarded it Will be a Handsome and Convenient Structure.

The members of the Associate Reformed Presbyterian church have awarded a contract to the Martin-Vandiver Lumber company for the erection of a handsome church building at the corner of North McDuffie and Society streets. The building will be a frame structure, 45 by 60 feet, and modern in every particular. It will cost completed about \$5,000. The plans were made by Mr. J. H. Casey, architect.

The church building will be equipped with Sunday school room and annex, to be connected to the main auditorium by folding doors, and will have a seating capacity of about 250 people. There are more than 100 pupils enrolled in the Sunday school, and there will be cloak rooms and toilets.

The A. R. P. church was organized here about four years ago with 35 members. Three years ago Rev. C. M. Boyd came here and assumed its pastorate, and since that time the membership has been increased to more than 100.

During his pastorate here Mr. Boyd has not only endeared himself to the members of his own church, but to the people generally, who will be interested in the announcement that a new church building is to be erected. It is expected that the actual work of construction will be begun this week, and it will be pushed rapidly to completion.

### KEPT SECRET TEN MONTHS

Columbia Girl and Abbeville Man Withheld Announcement of Their Marriage Pending the Latter's Admission to the Bar.

The many friends of Mr. Frank Clinkscales, of Abbeville, and Miss Eattie Alma Skinner, of Columbia, will be greatly surprised at the announcement of their marriage. They were secretly married by Rev. W. E. Wilkins at the parsonage in Columbia on May 19th, 1908, and the happy couple have kept it a secret till Mr. Clinkscales was admitted to the bar on February 1, 1909.

### Senator Gary's Maiden Speech.

The State. It is matter for regret that the speech made by Senator Frank E. Gary in opposition to the confirmation of Crum was delivered in executive session and therefore is not available for publication. It was the "maiden" effort of Mr. Gary in the Senate and, according to the fragmentary parts that have trickled out through the correspondents of The State and the Atlanta Constitu-

tion, it appears to have also been a novelty—at least in the South Carolina section of the Senate. Mr. Gary dealt in reason instead of in passion and prejudice, and he made the argument against the occupancy of the Charleston collectorship by a negro along the only lines that could bring to his side the support of Republican Senators. The State said, years ago, at the very beginning of the excitement incident to the appointment of Crum, that when the opposition to confirmation was based upon the fact that the appointee was a negro, there could be no hope of a reversal unless the character and business qualifications of the appointee could be successfully attacked. A change by a Republican President or a Republican Senate upon that ground would be stultification.

With the constitution as it stands, incompatibility between the official and those with whom he comes in official contact, presents the only sound foundation upon which to base opposition in this case. It should be antagonistic to the policy of any administration to force upon any community an official whose personality is objectionable. In considering the antagonism between an official and patrons of the office it is by no means necessary for the appointing power to indorse the cause of the antagonism in order to withdraw the appointment.

Had that line of procedure been followed years ago, instead of the attempt to force the abandonment of Crum because he is a negro, it would probably have been successful. As a means of securing notoriety, the pitchfork method is unexcelled, but if it has done other than harm to South Carolina, from a legislative standpoint, we do not recall the benefit.

Senator Gary, has presented the South Carolina side of the Crum con-

trovery in a clear, strong' and dignified argument! The State wishes to acknowledge its appreciation of the event. It is probably too late to affect results, and has been offset by Tillman's senseless and tactless tirade upon the same occasion. But, nevertheless, it must be accorded that Mr. Gary creditably performed his part.

#### A Good One
