SUPPLY ORDINANCE.

To Raise Supplies for the City of Abbeville, S. C., for the Fiscal Year 1911.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR and Aldermen of the City of Abbeville, S. C., in Council assembled and by authority of the same, That a tax for the same and in a manner hereinafter named shall be raised and paid into the treasury of the City Council for the uses and purposes thereof for the fiscal year 1911.

Notice is hereby given that the office of City Treasurer of Abbeville, S. C., will be open for the collection of taxes for said fiscal year 1911, from Tuesday, November 1, 1910, until Saturday, December 31, 1910, without penalty.

Rates per centum of taxation are as follows:
City tax (five) 5 mills
Waterworks tax (interest on bonds and sinking fund) (two) 2 mills
Electric Light tax (interest on bonds and sinking fund) (two) 2 mills
Sewerage tax (interest on bonds and sinking fund) (two) 2 mills

That when the taxes and assessments on any portion thereof charged against the property or party on the tax books of the city for the fiscal year 1911, shall not be paid on or before the first day of January, 1911, the City Treasurer shall proceed to add a penalty of one per cent on the tax book, and the City Treasurer shall collect the same, and if the said taxes, assessments and penalties are not paid on or before the first day of February next thereafter, an additional penalty of one per cent shall be added by the City Treasurer, and if said taxes, assessments and penalties are not paid on or before the first day of March next thereafter, an additional penalty of five per cent thereon shall be added by the City Treasurer and be collected by him; and if the said taxes, assessments and penalties are not paid on or before the fifteenth day of March next thereafter, the said City Treasurer shall issue his tax execution for said taxes, assessments and penalties against the property of the defaulting taxpayers according to law.

A commutation road tax will be collected the same time as other taxes from all male citizens between the ages of 18 and 50 years, except those exempted by law.

This commutation tax is as follows: The sum of two dollars payable before March 31st, 1911; the sum of two and 50-cent dollars if not paid until and during the month of April, 1911; the sum of three dollars if not paid until and during the month of May, 1911. In lieu of this tax six days work upon the highways and streets of the city will be required under the Street Overseer.

All persons failing or refusing to pay the commutation tax or to work six full days shall upon conviction be fined not more than thirty dollars or be imprisoned not more than thirty days.

LICENSE ORDINANCE.

State of South Carolina, City of Abbeville.

For the purpose of meeting in part the current expenses of the city government of the City of Abbeville, S. C., for the fiscal year beginning the 1st day of January, 1911, and to meet in part such other indebtedness of the City of Abbeville, S. C., as may become due in said fiscal year, therefore, be it ordained by the City Council of Abbeville, S. C., and by authority of the same:

Section 1. That no person, firm or corporation shall engage in, prosecute or carry on any trade, business, occupation or profession heretofore mentioned, without having first paid a special license tax therefor as follows, to wit:

Provided, that merchants who engage or are engaged in business in the said City of	

Abbeville for a shorter period than twelve months shall be required to pay a license fee of \$1.00 to \$250 dollars.	
Sec. 2. To constitute a merchant doing business in the City of Abbeville within the meaning of the foregoing section it shall be necessary for the person or persons so engaged to maintain and keep a place of business or office in the said City of Abbeville.

No person shall let or hire any wagon, cart or dray, or other carriage or vehicle for transportation of goods or passengers within the limits of the city, without having first obtained a badge from the City Clerk and Treasurer, under a penalty of five dollars for each and every day that such vehicle shall be so run, or five days imprisonment for each and every day run. Provided that nothing herein contained shall be construed to extend to wagons, carts or other vehicles going to and from market.

Sec. 2. Any person or persons carrying on any or prosecuting any business or occupation or running any establishment named in this or preceding sections, without first having taken out a license therefor, shall be fined, except in cases where special penalties are imposed, not less than two dollars nor more than one hundred dollars, or be imprisoned not less than two days nor more than thirty days, for each and every day such business is carried on without such license. That no license shall be issued for a less period than one year (unless otherwise specified) dated from the first day of the month in which same is issued, and it shall be the duty of the Clerk of Council to see that licenses and fees are imposed and paid, and to promptly report any and all cases of failure to do so.	
Sec. 3. That for any business, occupation or profession not enumerated in the foregoing sections, the license shall be regulated and imposed by the City Council on any meeting of the same.	
Sec. 4. The City Council hereby reserves the right to refuse or revoke any license for any cause which may seem to it just.	

Sec. 5. That any firm, person or corporation making any false or fraudulent returns, where a return is necessary or required under this Ordinance, shall upon conviction be fined not exceeding fifty dollars nor less than five dollars, or be imprisoned not exceeding thirty days nor less five days.

Sec. 6. That any person, firm or corporation carrying on or prosecuting any trade, business, occupation or profession, or running any establishment named in this Ordinance, or upon which a license may hereafter be imposed by the City Council, without first having taken out a license therefor, shall be fined (except in cases where special penalties are imposed) not less than two dollars nor more than one hundred dollars or be imprisoned not less than two days nor more than thirty days in the county or city prison for each and every day such business, occupation or profession is carried on without such license.

That this Ordinance shall go into effect on the first day of November, 1910, and all persons, firms, corporations or professions not conforming to its requirements shall be liable to the penalties herein imposed from and after last mentioned date.

IN ACCORDANCE WITH AN ACT to raise supplies for the fiscal year commencing January 1, 1910, notice is hereby given that the office of County Treasurer for Abbeville County will be open for the collection of taxes for said fiscal year from Saturday, October 15th, until Saturday, December 31st, without penalty. There will be added—

A penalty of one per cent on all taxes not paid on January 1st, 1911.

A poll tax of One Dollar per capita on all male citizens between the age of 21 and 60 years, except such as are exempt by law, will be collected.

A commutation road tax of One Dollar will be collected the same time as other taxes from all male citizens between the ages of 18 and 50 years, except such as are exempted by law. Unless said tax is paid by first of March, 1911, eight days work upon the public highways will be required under an overseer, if so much be necessary.

Taxes are payable only in gold and silver coin, United States currency, National Bank Notes and Coupons of State Bonds which become payable during the year 1909. A tax of 50 cents will be collected on each dollar by mail in regard to their taxes which will please write before December 15th, stating the location of their property and inc use postage for reply, and those paying taxes by check must include the charge for collection.
