ELECTROCUTED.

Charlie Logan, who was convicted at the recent term of court, of murdering Mrs. Scott, at her home near Lowndesville, in the early part of the summer, and who was sentenced by Judge Frank B. Gary to die by electrocution, paid the penalty for his crime, in the death house, at Columbia, on Friday of last week, 15th.

Logan entered the home of the old lady during the night and killed her by striking her with a hammer, or wrench. Logan was arrested next day when it was earned that he made the ladder the evening before, which was used in entering the house.

He confessed to parties at the time, but later made conflicting statements about the matter, in an endeavor to shield himself by implicating others. On his trial he sought to lay the crime at the door of other negroes who were on the place, but the jury did not accept his version of the offense. Logan confessed as he was being
