HOW TO HANDLE WINTER COVER CROPS

Clemson College, March 20 .- Advice as to spring handling of cover crops should vary to suit conditions. The farmer who has large acreage of Abruzzi rye as a cover crop to of Abruzzi rye as a cover crop to handle with a limited horse power, would do well to begin at once to disk and turn the rankest growth where early plantings are to be made. Plant the area turned each week. This allows a greater growth on the remainder, yet keeps his teams and labor busy and gets more nearly the maximum benefits from

Those who have ample teams, tools and labor might delay beginning preparations until a heavier growth is obtained, especially if the area is not large. Rye should be thoroughly disked both ways before turning and should never be allowed to get beyond the stage of bunching for head, before disking.

Clover and vetch should be turned

after disking, when they begin to bloom. Turned while tender and green they are easily cut to pieces by disking and are soon decayed giving up the plant food they con-

tain for use by the following crop.

Never turn a cover crop, which is to be followed by a cultivated crop, without first thoroughly disking both ways, otherwise failure may be expected of the following crop in several particulars which space here does not permit enumerating.




