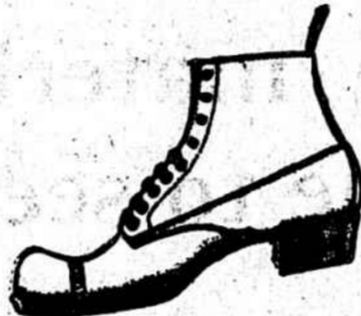

RULES—No entry fee charged and committee will feed and care for birds. Entries close day before Fair. No fowls can be removed until after 5 p. m., the last day of the Fair, except for sanitary reasons.

The expert Judge will confine the awards strictly to those named in premium list. The new American standard of perfection will govern in varieties except Pit Games, which will be judged for their pit qualities. Where only one entry is exhibited in a class first class prize will be awarded, if worthy, but only second money will be paid. All shippers of poultry must plainly mark each coop with owner's name and shipping point, that all may be promptly returned at close of Fair without mistake.

The birds will be judged by comparison. Money prizes paid only on varieties named in premium list.

Prizes on Poultry.
I. On best pen of any one variety, First, \$1.00; Second, 50 cents; Third, ribbon.
II. 50 cents; Second, 25 cents; Third, ribbon.
On cock, hen, cockerel and pullet. (Cock and hen, birds hatched prior to 1915, cockerel and pullets, birds hatched during 1915.)
