SARGENT'S PORTRAIT OF WILSON ON VIEW

\$50,000 Painting at the Metropolitan Will Go Later to Dublin Gallery.

John S. Sargent's \$50,000 oil portrait of President Wilson was placed on view yesterday in the Metropolitan Museum of Art, where it will remain until Feb. 10. It has been shown for several weeks in the Corcoran Gallery of Art, Washington, and following the New York exhibition it may be seen elsewhere. The final destination will be the Dublin Art Gallery, legatee of the art possessions of Sir Hugh Lane, who was director of that institution and who was lost with the Lusitania. Mr. Sargent offered to paint the portrait for \$50,000 and to give the money to the Red Cross, and Sir Hugh Lane gave the order for it.

The President is seen seated and leaning slightly forward, as if in an attentive conversation. He wears the conventional frock suit.

MANY NURSES REQUIRED.

Washington, Jan. 23.—Enlistment of 30,000 women in the military nursing service will be required if prospective needs of the government are to be met, the American Red Cross announced recently in an appeal for volunteers.

In order to meet the increasing demand of the army and navy nurse corps, the Red Cross has modified somewhat its former requirements for enrollment. The age limit has been lowered to twenty-one years and in special cases nurses over forty may be accepted.
