### DETERMINED TO RETURN SOLDIERS BY SEPTEMBER

Washington, May 4.—Determination of President Wilson, indicated in press advices from Paris, that no American troops shall continue on German soil for a longer period after the signing of the peace treaty than may be necessary to embark them for home is borne out by present

plans of the War Department, which contemplate the return of the entire American expeditionary forces by September. Because of this General March, chief of staff, is making every effort to speed up the demobilization in this country.

An official announcement issued today as to the accumulation of surplus clothing for the troops stated that the estimates were based on "troop withdrawal to be completed in September." The statement also said that "if an army of occupation is maintained after September a portion of this surplus will be needed."

This computation was taken to reflect exactly the present information of the department as to future troop movements.

The September date represents estimates by debarkation, officials as to the maximum possible speed in withdrawing the entire force in Europe, including the troops holding the Coblenz bridgehead sector on the Rhine. If anything, officers anticipate that the movement will be accelerated rather than retarded. The schedule has been exceeded recently and in increasing measure from week to week with an indicated monthly movement of 450,000 men, the best predictions of General March and his aides bid fair, it was said, to be more than realized.

### OVER 200 DRINK CURE INSTITUTIONS TO CLOSE

Chicago, May 8.—Plans are being made by owners of more than 200 drink cure institutions to discontinue business with the coming of national prohibition, according to officials of institutions here. A few of the places may continue indefinitely as drug cure sanitariums, but a large majority is expected to close within a year.

James E. Bruce, an official of a drink cure corporation that advertises it has cured more than 500,000 victims of alcohol, said the prohibition wave had for some time caused decreased business.

"We figure there will be no need for our institutions after the country goes dry," he said. "However, we expect business to increase for a few months right after prohibition becomes effective. But after that it will rapidly decrease."

"A few years ago we had sixty branches in operation throughout the country. Today we have 26. Drug cases constitute about 25 per cent of our business, the number being about the same as before the Harrison anti-drug law went into effect five years ago. But we do not think it would pay to continue treating drug cases alone."

### SWEET POTATO STORAGE HOUSES

Clemson College, May 7.—Geo. P. Hoffmann, Extension Service Horticulturist, has prepared and sent to County Agent M. P. Moore of Laurens County the blanks to be used by him with sweet potato growers and the manager of the Laurens Sweet Potato Storage House. These agreement forms will doubtless be used in various other counties which have established or will establish potato houses for public use.

The agreement calls upon the farmer to grow certain standard varieties from disease-free seed or plants on land not planted in potatoes for three years; to harvest, grade, and handle potatoes according to certain approved specifications; to deliver potatoes within a specified time; and to pay a storage charge of 25c. per bushel or 20 per cent of the potatoes.

The storage house authorities do not guarantee against loss resulting

from rates except to refund storage charges; but with the losses in such houses not over two per cent, there is practically no risk on the farmer's part.

Laurens County has taken a decidedly progressive step in this matter, and it is expected that many other counties and communities not already provided with potato houses will follow suit.

### LABEL FRUITS AND VEGETABLES

Fruits and vegetables in package form should be labeled with the quantity of contents when shipped within the jurisdiction of the Federal Food and Drugs Act, say the officials of the Bureau of Chemistry, United States Department of Agriculture, in charge of the enforcement of that law.

The requirements of the net weight amendment to the Federal Food and Drugs Act in its applica-

tion to the labeling of fruits and vegetables in package form have been widely distributed among shippers and other interested parties. Shippers of fruits and vegetables who fail to comply with the requirements of the law are liable to prosecution in the Federal courts, say the officials. Food inspectors have been instructed to watch interstate shipments of fruits and vegetables during this season to see that the packages are labeled with the quantity of contents in accordance with the requirements of the law.

Complete rulings regarding the labeling of the quantity of contents of fruits and vegetables coming within the jurisdiction of the Federal Food and Drugs Act, and regarding certain exemptions, which have been published in Service and Regulatory Announcement, No. 21, will be mailed upon application to the Bureau of Chemistry, United States Department of Agriculture, Washington, D. C.
