GENERAL NEWS. Washington, Nov. 14.—A maximum wholesale price of 10 1-2 cents a pound for all beet sugars at all points in the United States was established today by the department of justice. New Schedule Signed For Customs Duties. D'Annunzio Said to Have left Fiume. Trieste, Nov. 14.—A telegram to the stock exchange here states that Gabriele d'Annunzio has left Fiume. Ending of War. New Orleans, Nov. 14.—The President of the United States is the only person who can say when the war with Germany ended, and therefore, the sale or carrying of intoxicating liquor into territory adjacent to a military camp or cantonment is forbidden until he does so, ruled the United States circuit court of appeals today in affirming the sentence of 15 months in the federal penitentiary imposed upon Lucien C. Slaughter, of Tarrant county, Texas, after a trial before the federal court of the northern district of Texas. Drastic Legislation to Handle I. W. W. New York, Nov. 14.—Drastic legislation to exterminate the I. W. W. may be asked of the next New York legislature, if existing statutes fail to accomplish the purpose; it is stated by state officials active in running down the radical element. Illinois Miners Have Ignored Court Order. Joliet, Ills., Nov. 14.—Miners in the Wilmington coal district at meetings last night voted to ignore the strike recall and will remain idle until settlement is made on the demands on the operators. They also refused to allow maintenance men in the mines to stay on duty. Daughters Plan a War Relic Building. Tampa, Fla., Nov. 14.—At the morning convention of the United Daughters of the Confederacy today the Daughters resolved to undertake the construction of a \$35,000 fire-proof building at Richmond as a place for safekeeping for records and valuable war relics. The action was taken on the motion of Mrs. Norman Randolph, of the Richmond chapter. Negro Electrocuted. Columbia, Nov. 14.—(Special).—Mose Witherspoon a negro convicted recently in Lancaster county for the murder of Luther Horton, a young white man, was electrocuted at the state penitentiary here this afternoon at 12:20 o'clock. Texan Loses Biggest Damage Suit. Houston, Tex., Nov. 14.—The largest damage suit ever tried in Harris county, for \$45,000,000, involving 160 acres of land in Humble oil field, ended today when Judge J. M. Harvey, of the eighth district court, ruled that the grant of A. Goldman, a plaintiff from the state of Texas, had been allowed to lapse and was rescinded. Widow of Tolstoi Has Passed Away. London, Nov. 14.—Countess Lee Tolstoi, widow of the famous Russian novelist, died at Yasnya Poliana November 4, according to a dispatch to the Daily Mail from Helsingfors quoting the Krasnaya Gazette. Prince of Wales Has Strenuous Day. White Sulphur Springs, W. Va., Nov. 15.—The Prince of Wales spent the first of his three days of rest here by walking ten miles, spending an hour in a swimming pool, golfing three hours and dancing for three more. At the conclusion of this program he seemed to have recovered considerably from the fatigue of his strenuous four day visit to Washington. Cross Hill Boy Is Named West Point Alternate.
