DENTIST GETS SENTENCE

Charleston, June 20 .- In federal court today, Judge H. A. M. Smith sentenced Dr. M. A. Woods, dentist of Columbia, convicted of violating the narcotic act, to \$1,000 fine, with costs and 18 months in the federal prison at Atlanta.

Counsel for the defendant gave notice of appeal, and Dr. Woods was released uder bond of \$5,000, pending the outcome of the appeal. Dr. Woods was found guilty several Res. 388 days ago, and a motion for a new trial was refused by Judge Smith, who announced he would impose sentence today. The defendant was charged with selling cocaine to two addicts under four counts. Judge Smith has adjourned the June term.
