Turns Down Presidency of William Jewell College in Liberty, Missouri.

Greenville, July 6.—Announcement was made this afternoon by Dr. W. J. McGlothlin, president of Furman University, that he had decided to decline the offer of the presidency of William Jewell College at Liberty, Mo., and would remain at the head of Furman University. The offer from the Missouri institution was received by Dr. McGlothlin several weeks ago and has been under careful consideration since that time.

Formal announcement of his decision to remain at Furman was made by Dr. McGlothlin in a letter to John A. Russell, president of the Greenville Chamber of Commerce, in which he says that "assurances of interest and support on the part of the citizens of Green-
