PAYING UP THE TAXES.—The County Treasurer informs us, that since he opened his books on the 20th ult., up to the present time, that in no one year since he has been charged with the duties of the office, has taxpayers met him so promptly, paid up so well, or so cheerfully as they have this year.

On a reasonable basis of calculation, it was thought impossible to meet these formidable columns of Midianish figures set in array against taxpayers. But the majority of our people, and the larger taxpayers at that, have promptly paid up.

The limited time for collecting taxes, has worked hard against both the Treasurer and the taxpayer. The Treasurer anticipated visitin each precinct, and advertised accordingly, but no provision having been made by the authorities for extending the time beyond the 5th inst. he was obliged to close his books without visiting four precincts.

It is bad enough to be taxed so infernally, but this want of time to count your money is the unkindest cut of all. We pity the hundreds and thousands who may be ruined from this cause alone, and it is no use to say that this thing was unavoidable on the part of the Legislature! Not so; each and every individual member, should be held personally responsible to their constituents, and we hope it will be remembered in the next general election.

No MEETING.—The taxpayers of this County held no meeting, on Monday, for the purpose of electing delegates to the Taxpayers' convention that is to meet in Columbia on the 17th inst. Each taxpayer seemed wholly absorbed in trying to pay up his present taxes, listlessly obeying the injunction of Scripture, "Let us get no thought for the morrow," yet because of the heavy tax, especially the school tax for this township, violating the command "Swear not at all."

We are a queer people in this same independent Republic of Horry, we will curse each other, but you must not curse us; and thus it is in regard to the matters both State and County in which each individual should be more or less directly interested, one waits for another and another waits for somebody else to move in the matter, making the old adage true, "what's every body's business is no body's business."

This was fully illustrated last June when the township meeting was called, according to the requirements of law, to take into consideration the necessity of a tax levy for school purpose, not a half dozen taxpayers from the country met in that meeting, but quietly suffered non-taxpayers to levy five mills upon them, at which they now complain, and so it will ever be, until they take as deep an interest in their own matters as do those into whose pockets the tax money goes.

Wonder if any of the taxpayers will come from the country to attend the next District School tax levy meeting? We think a doubtful.
