

HAMBURG, Nov. 21.

Cotton.—For several days past our market has been brisk and the range of prices a shade higher than our last Tuesdays quotations.

It will be seen by reference to the latest European news in another column that the accounts are a little more favorable, and we think indicates pretty clearly that cotton has seen its lowest point.

We notice that the receipts of the present season up to the latest dates amounts to 443,382 bales, against 281,892 for the same time last year showing an excess for the present season of 161,490 bales.

Cotton.—The good demand noticed in our last review, continued up to Tuesday evening, and prices were steadily maintained, with scarcely a shade of variation from those given in our last report.
