How solemn, how glorious the thought, that she, who one short month ago, was here with us, is now in glory, seeing us face to face, and enjoying those pleasures which are at God's right hand for evermore. O! could she speak to us at this time, would she not say to all of us, both Teachers and Scholars, "Be in earnest, for the Lord is at hand, and his reward is with him." Yes, let her God be our God, her Saviour our Saviour, and he will give us such good things as pass man's understanding, even, an eternal weight of glory. Let us remember that, that God, who she and all holy beings serve in heaven, we are also endeavoring to serve. He is here present with us, may he aid and bless us!

The number of Teachers is the same as at the close of last month. In the occasional absence of one or more of our regular Teachers, their places have been kindly supplied by other Ladies. To those who occasionally have been engaged in this labor of love, I tender my hearty thanks, and pray that while blessing others they may be blessed of the Lord, and "turning many to righteousness," may hereafter shine as stars for ever and ever.

The number of names upon the roll at present is 112—that is, white children 35, and colored adults and children 77. To-day 33 were present. The average attendance has been about 79 for each of the three Sundays of this month, on which we were able to open our Schools. I have forborne this month to erase any names from the roll because the weather has twice interrupted the regularity of our School. I trust may have led some to forget the assembling a ourselves in the Sunday School. I have been very much gratified to learn that two of our colored scholars have applied to be received as candidates for baptism, and are inquiring "What must I do to be saved?" May this anxious inquiry be heard from many more,—yea from all of our scholars.

I need scarcely inform you, that the instruction of the colored scholars is *altogether oral*, and our Teachers wholly trustworthily. The Catechism used is one prepared by the Rev. C. JONES, D. D., a Presbyterian Clergyman, a native Georgian, who has labored for many years, in this State as well as Georgia, among our slave population.

Since my last there has been quite a change in our Cotton Market.

The advice by the last Steamer has operated more on the market than was anticipated. Buyers are less anxious to operate, and generally offer 1-2 to 3-4 cents less than the highest prices paid last week. We quote from 54 to 9 cents.—Some new Cotton is selling as low as 73, that is "storm cotton."

There is still a good demand for Bacon, prices steady, 12 1-2 cts. Flour from \$6 a \$9. Corn has depreciated in value very little, good white is worth 90 cts per bushel.
