Another provision authorizes an excess of gold to be sold annually for United States notes in open market when the sum in the Treasury is above fifty mil-

Mr. Stevens offered a resolution, the Senate concurring, that when Congress adjourned it adjourn to meet on Saturday, December 1st, unless sooner called together, which power, in case of emergency, is hereby granted to the presiding officers of both Houses. Some objections being made to considering the resolution now, Mr. Stevens withdrew it, but gave notice that he should offer it to-morrow. The resolution declares that Tennessee is again entitled to be represented by Senators and Representatives duly elected and qualified, upon the condition that the oath of office required by the existing law shall be taken. The result was hailed with general applause on the floor and in the galleries.

The joint resolution was then sent to the Senate for concurrence.
