

Congressional. WASHINGTON, July 19. SENATE.—A bill has passed appropriating fifty thousand dollars to the Portland sufferers. Trumbull offered joint resolution recognizing Tennessee as a State, as such entitled to all guarantees and rights; ordered to be printed.

HOUSE.—A resolution to adjourn on the twenty-fifth was laid on the table. The bill to fund the national debt was taken up and an amendment was adopted prohibiting depositing money in National Banks where there was a United States depository. The bill was passed. It provides for the payment of one hundred and eighty millions annually on principal and interest of the United States debt.

The Radical Representatives agree to the Admission of Tennessee. WASHINGTON, July 20, 1866. In the House of Representatives a joint resolution restoring Tennessee to her former relations with the Union was passed by yeas 125, nays 12. The resolution declares that Tennessee is again entitled to be represented by Senators and Representatives duly elected and qualified, upon the condition that the oath of office required by the existing law shall be taken.

THE HOUSE ALSO LAID ON THE TABLE, BY A VOTE OF 103 YEAS TO 75 NAYS, THE RESOLUTION INTRODUCED BY THAD. STEVENS, PROVIDING FOR A RECESS OF CONGRESS UNTIL THE FIRST SATURDAY IN DECEMBER, AND GIVING THE PRESIDING OFFICERS OF BOTH BRANCHES THE POWER TO CONVENE THEIR RESPECTIVE HOUSES, AT AN EARLIER PERIOD IF THEY DEEM IT NECESSARY.
