The Progressives have adopted buttons instead of hooks and eyes, and this is denounced as a sinful conformity to the ways of a wicked world, and the wearers of buttons are denounced as the enemies of pure and undefiled religion. The hook and eye party contend that the Scriptures mention hooks and eyes, while buttons are not once spoken of.

## THE END OF IT—The results of the recent elections in Alabama and Kentucky furnish all the evidence that is needed to satisfy the whole South as to the Mahoning of the whole party to the States, and for his entire life he will be in the study of his profession. His keen insight into human nature, his thorough knowledge of law, and his knowledge gained by thorough reading of the great works of the day, added to his high character, will give us a Congressman of whom we can be justly proud. He will be no more an lobbyist, but will be one who will strive to make the name of his district and his people known in Congress as pure and noble people.—Darlington Times.
