

FASHION NOTES

Plaid is the fashion for everything—coats, gowns, capes and blouses.

The fancy for silk mixtures and silk-figured goods continues. Many of the pretty, rough wollens are figured with fine silk lines in interesting patterns.

A dainty little theater bonnet, in the trimming of which high disposals were studiously avoided, is made of cream white point de Gene lace, with a face trimming of twisted black velvet, which effectually counteracts the trying effects of the white upon the face.

Plaid silks are effective when combined with plain wool goods. The clear colors are displayed in a material called radzimir Ecoesse, a soft silk that will brighten the most sombre cloth with which it may be used.

Cordurette is a new woolen showing a crinkled surface between groups of small cords. It is pretty when made up without trimming.

Pongee, either dyed or in its natural color, is the most durable of silks, and is much liked for petticoats since taffeta has been found to wear so unsatisfactorily.

White or light-hued full sleeves are seen in dark house costumes, and distinguish them from street dresses of similar weight and texture.

The handles of the newest parasols and umbrellas are made to unscrew in order to be carried by tourists in their trunk or traveling bags.

Pique or Suede gloves will replace the chamois and wash-leather gloves so much favored during the summer. They are strong and shapely and very stylish for walking wear.

Mousquetaire gloves are again fashionable. They look well over sleeves that are close-fitting at the wrists.

Empire vests, that may conceal a multitude of worn or stained spots in the basque of a street costume, are introduced as very dressy accessories and as special accompaniments to the short, jaunty jackets but recently revived. The styles vary in these vests, and both slender and short figures may be suited.

The "clothes tree" comes now with all suites of furniture, and is supplying a need which may have existed, but cannot be said to have been serious before its appearance.

Twisted puff trimmings of chiffon crepe or net make dainty foot-garnitures for evening gowns; and rope trimmings of ribbon or cord are favored for street costumes.

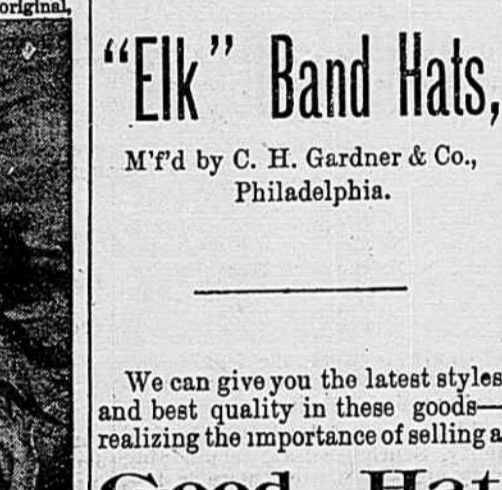
