TAX ACT OF 1882.

The new Comptroller General Epton, is endeavoring to enforce the tax law of 1882 that the other chief tax officers of the State have hitherto ignored. The act to

which we refer requires that: Section 229 (177.) Any person who shall at any place in this state, be engaged in the business of buying and selling personal property, or in selling personal property consigned to him from any place out of the state, or property not the product of this state; consigned to him from any place within the state, shall be held to be a merchant, and, at the same time, he is required to list bis other personal property, shall deliver to the auditor of the county in which his business is situated a statement under his oath, of the average monthly value of the personal property, moneys and credits pertaining to his mercantile business; to ascertain which he shall set down the value on hand on the first day of Jaruary of the preceding year, or other time of commencing business during the year, add there to all purchases when made at cost, and the remainder shall be the average of hand for that month; and is like manner ascertain the averag value for each month, down to the first day of January of the year in which the return is to be made add together such monthly values divide the aggregate by the number of months he has been in busines during the preceding year a aforesaid, and to the quotient adthe moneys and credits on hand the first day of January in th year in which the return is made and the product of this las addition shall be the sum upon which he shall pay taxes for the year in which the return is made Provided, That what when business is opened after the first day of the preceding year and closed be fore the first day of January of the year in which the return is much the parties opening and closing


