

The Queen is the first turbine passenger steamship to be placed on the regular English channel service. She will make the trip from Dover to Calais, a distance of 24.2 statute miles, in less than an hour. The Samphire, an express steamship on the same route of forty years ago, had a speed on official trial, of 15.3 miles per hour. The Nord, built in 1898, which is now running, although showing a trial speed of 21.5 knots, developed a schedule service of only 15.8 knots. Owing to the shallow harbor at Calais, the vessels of this line are limited to a draught of ten feet.
