For Representative in Congress 2nd District.

STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA, COUNTY OF EDGEFIELD.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Special Election for Representative in Congress will be held at the voting precincts fixed by law in the county of Edgefield on Tuesday, May 17, 1904.

The qualifications for suffrage are as follows: Residence in the State for two years, in the county one year, in the polling precinct in which the elector offers to vote, four months, and the payment six months before any election of any poll tax then due and payable; Provided, That ministers in charge of an organized church and teachers of public schools shall be entitled to vote after six months residence in the State, otherwise qualified.

Registration. Payment of all taxes, including poll tax, assessed and collectable during the previous year. The production of a certificate or of the receipt of taxes shall be conclusive proof of the payment thereof.

Before the hour fixed for opening the polls, Managers and Clerks must take and subscribe the Constitutional oath. The Chairman of the Board of Managers can administer the oath to other Managers and to the Clerk; a Notary Public must administer the oath to the Chairman. The Managers elect their Chairman and Clerk.

Polls at each voting place must be opened at 7 o'clock a. m., and closed at 4 o'clock p. m. The Managers have the power of filling vacancies, and if none of the Managers attend, the citizens can appoint from among the qualified voters the Managers, who, after being sworn, can conduct the election.

At the close of the election, the Managers and Clerks must proceed publicly to open the ballot boxes and count the ballots therein, and continue without adjournment until the same is completed, and make a statement of the result for each office and sign the same.

Within three days thereafter, the Chairman of the Board or some one designated by the Board, must deliver to the Commissioners of Election the poll list, the boxes containing the ballots and written statements of the result of the election. Commission is of Federal Election, Edgefield County, April 18, 1904.

You are hereby appointed a Manager of Election—Precinct and you are required to be at Edgefield Court house on the 14th day of May 1904, to take the oath and receive boxes, instructions, etc. Hereto fail not.
