WARMED GRAIN FOR POULTRY.

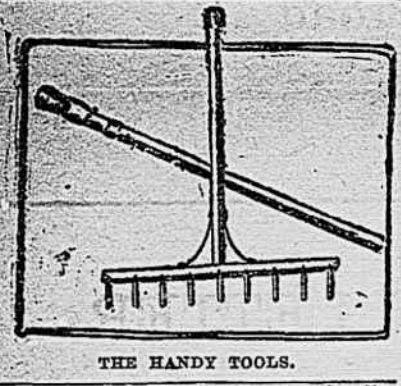
Mention has been made in this department of the plan of the writer in feeding whole corn to fowls at night and having it almost hot.
