The most notable occasion of the century in educational circles in this state was the centennial celebration of the South Carolina college which was held in Columbia this week.

The farmers all over the south are organizing with the hope and belief that through their combined efforts a better price can be realized for the unsold portion of the crop of 1904, and that the production for 1905 can be curtailed.

Since our appeal of last week to the business men of Edgefield to arouse from their lethargy and put forth a united effort for the industrial development of our town, we have noticed that nearly a half million dollars have been paid out in dividends by the banks, cotton mills and other enterprises of Anderson.

There is a Difference.

There are some who contend that there is nothing wrong in speculating in futures, that it is the same as buying the actual cotton. To those we say: Suppose it were a matter of current report, and was generally believed, that the officials of one of the Edgefield banks were habitually speculating in futures, how soon the stockholders would become uneasy and how soon the deposits of that bank would very materially decrease, and those of the other bank correspondingly increase.

Committee of One Hundred.

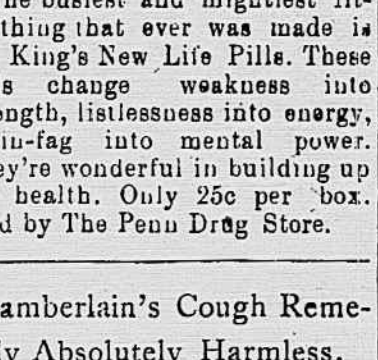

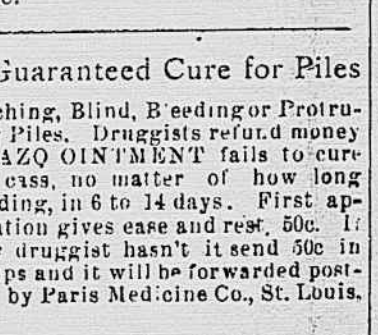
