C. 1734" and "B. C. 1740," respectively, "B. C." meaning British .Colony., .The law at that time forbade the working of iron in the colony beyond the pig iron state, and required same to be marked "B. C." and shipped to England in exchange for articles of utility.

After the war the armor plate of the famous Merrimac or Virginia, which revolutionized naval warfare in the famous battle in Hampton' Roads, March 18, 1862, was sold to the Old Dominion Iron and Natl Works, Richmond, Va. The armor plate was removed by divers and purchased by the Old Belle Isle company, and worked up into horse shoes and other useful articles. A piece of this armor plates which was struck by a ball, is on exhibit at Jamestown Exposition, and some of it has been worked up into handsome souvenirs, such as miniature horse shoes and anchors.
